| <p>5.</p> | <p><b><u>Lesley Jellyman Visit:</u></b></p> <p>Richard Knowles and the committee expressed how they found the meeting beneficial. One of the key points they picked up on was regarding the It's Your Neighbourhood Awards and the importance of not "chasing them".</p> <p>The committee agreed that this year the organisation must start earlier. Zoe gave everyone a form for applying to the IYNA so they can approach groups and local community projects, making them aware that all the information must be given to herself by the Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> February at the latest in order to register all the applicants in time.</p> <p>Bert and Cynthia will contact "The Lions" who will be re developing the Floral Clock. Cllr Willis will be speaking to "The Colton Centre" and seeing if they would like to enter. Kareen Williams will liaise with Worlebury School and their entry.</p> <p>Cllr Willis thought the idea put forward by Lesley of building sculptures from rubbish was brilliant and thought it was something Weston in Bloom could take forward. Cllr Willis has spoken to Bev Tucker and they thought it would be good if they could get the schools involved. The children could collect small items such as bottle tops, Cans and other recyclable items which would usually be thrown away and use then to produce sculptures.
